

As most of you are now aware we have a new home for the dedicated catalogue PC. It is situated in the main library area, between the journals and the map cabinet. It creates a little more space for users.

Remember the catalogue is a record of the resources of all GMIT libraries. If you need to know if the library has a particular title it is your first port of call.

A few improvements recently made to OPAC.

Click on Featured lists on the main catalogue page. Note the lists of Castlebar Theses and Journals. Soon you will see lists of Castlebar Videos, Audio cassettes and CD-rom up there also _____ a handy ready reference guide.

Self Service with OPAC.

You can check you're A/C to see titles you have borrowed, when they are due back, and possibly renew them.

Choose 'view your record' from the main catalogue page.

Enter your name and barcode (number on your library card).

Enter your PIN. (Get it at library desk).

Click on 'Display record for person.....' button.

Self Service with OPAC cont.

Inter Library Loans are books and journal articles not available in GMIT libraries and so we borrow them from other colleges. You can send your requests to the library electronically instead of filling the forms at the library desk.

Choose 'Inter Library Loan Request' from the main catalogue page.

Choose relevant 'form'.

Enter details. (Be as comprehensive as you can).

You get the option here to 'search library catalogue' to find out if GMIT libraries can supply your title.

If not available in GMIT carry on and enter your name, barcode and PIN.

Click on 'submit this request'.

Library staff will process your requests.
